At present, Singapore imports over 90 per cent of its food from close to 170 countries and regions. Singapore's food security strategy through self-reliance in food stockpiling and open trading lines with partners cannot be ignored. Spray painting and sandblasting

We helped our customer, KC Dat transport, sandblast and spray paint a telescopic brush attachment.



The height and size of the structure was the greatest challenge as it was barely able to fit in the spray booth, with only a slight allowance in the height. This made the masking process slightly more difficult than usual, but we were able to navigate around this successfully and safely transported the item back to the customer's premises at Jurong Port.

Chances are once you get started, you will keep going for longer than 10 minutes!


